Cancellations & Changes made by students

Full Refund:

To be eligible for a full refund, the student must contact the Alliance Française before the first class.

Credit:

After the first class, only a credit for a next session will be issued (a \$35 cancellation fee plus \$35 per class is retained). Credit is valid for one year starting from the date of withdrawal.

No credit after the 3rd class.

Late fees apply 2 weeks after the beginning of classes

Enrollment is contingent upon advanced payment for course and materials.

To be eligible for a refund, students must contact the office at least 24 hours before the first class. After the first class, only a credit for the next session will be issued (a \$35.00 cancellation fee plus \$35.00 per class is retained by the Alliance Française).

No credit is issued after the end of the 3rd week of classes.

Late fees apply 1 week after the first day of class.
